

The 2022 Achiever of the Year winner, Greg Bridges, was referred to Goodwill of Mid-Michigan with a dream of publishing a book of his own poetry. After creating a business plan, Greg obtained a Genesee county DBA - Mr. Cool Breeze Poetry From The Mind.

He is working with Goodwill to take his vast collection of handwritten poetry, type it out, design book illustrations, and format the book in order to publish it on Amazon.

During this process, he has learned adaptive technology. With the use of Apple's adaptive features on the iPad, he was able to research illustration concepts and type out short sentences. Artificial Intelligence art allows him to have a control over his own artwork. Greg has learned to be patient in the process. At the same time, he is his strongest advocate. He has developed a professional sense of self as he talks with people about his work and the process. He will sell many books by word of mouth alone.







The 2022 Graduate of the Year-Runner Up, Theresa Lake, was referred to Goodwill of Mid-Michigan for assistance with finding a job. She had previously worked in food service, but was looking for a position in a different industry. She was patient during the job search and was very eager to learn new skills. Eventually, she found an opportunity at a daycare and was excited to promptly apply for the position.

The daycare hired Theresa immediately, and she has proven to be a valued employee. Theresa has worked very hard at obtaining the skills she needs to maintain this employment, such as learning each student's name and interests. She implemented a process for herself to assist with taking phone messages and continues to seek how to better her performance at work. She continues to be an important part of the team at the daycare.







The Achiever of the Year-Runner-Up, Angelina Belanger, was referred to Goodwill of Mid-Michigan in 2022 to assess her skills and prepare her further for job search. She completed a Work Based Experience at the Saginaw Goodwill store.


